...is organizing a humanitarian drive to collect 100.000 dinars for a Drop-In Center for Children of the Street.

Why this action?

Streets belong to everyone, they are indivisible, everyone should feel safe and secure on them. Still, the streets are the scene of violence and discrimination, with hate and intolerance shown towards certain groups. And, it is perhaps mostly those who live, work and sleep on the streets, for which the streets are their life, that suffer most. Children who live on the streets are malnourished, have no place to bathe, have no identification documents, no access to health institutions, they sleep on the streets and the most endangered are the girls.

Thanks to the professionals and volunteers of Drop-in Center, who are there for the children 24 hours a day, thousands of meals have been served, hundreds of children have had the opportunity to bathe and to get urgent healthcare...

Queeria centre activists believe that linking marginalized groups, expressing mutual respect and solidarity are important preconditions for the creation of a different, better and more just society for all of us.

Where is your place in this action?

By purchasing one of these 20 unique, one-off bags with reproductions of the works of artists who unselfishly gave their works to us—you are helping us to raise 100.000 dinars for the Shelter. This money enough to provide for two months of food for children living on the streets or for four months of psycho-social assistance, or 7 months of learning writing skills.

Bags are made of good quality, impermeable shotex material, and are covered inside also with impermeable fabric made with Mont technology. They are dark navy in colour, 33x30 cm and 10cm wide. The shoulder strap length is 130 cm and can be adjusted to whatever length you desire.

The bag has two compartments and is very comfortable for everyday use.





The fundraising action has been organized by Queeria on behalf of the Centre and the artists and would like to thank the artists who generously contributed the use of their work for this cause..

In order to reach the target of 100,000 dinars for the Centre, the minimum price for each bag is 5,000 dinars.

Since the action is of humanitarian nature, once your contribution arrives to the bank account you become the owner of the first available bag according to the order in the catalogue (for example if your payment arrives sixth you become the owner of bag number 6)

Unfortunately, due to limited capacity and demanding technology we could produce only 20 bags this time. In case your contribution arrives 21st and you still want to support the Drop In Center, you can tell us how much you would like to contribute and us how you would like your contribution to be spent in the Center. Also, if you would like to contribute

any amount but are not interested in a bag—your contribution would be greatly appreciated and will go to the Centre.

REMARK: The idea is to collect funds by 22 May and deliver it to the Centre for Integration of Youth team at the opening ceremony of the new Drop-In Center in Belgrade.
